

Pastor's Letter January 2023

"The hope and fears of all the years, Are met in thee tonight" (From the hymn O Little Town of Bethlehem)

What a promise we are given...at the birth of the Christ Child...all we hope for and all we fear are is taken care of. Prayers heard...prayers answered.
